## NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

## Australian Dollar 77.33 US as of 5/08/2005

This week sales resumed in Sydney & Fremantle after a 3 week sale recess with a offering of 48,716 bales nationally. The AUD was trading around 3.1 cents higher (4%) than when the last sale was held in Sydney on 7/7/05.

The Sydney market opened on Tuesday with an offering of 5,751 bales. All microns, except the finer better style & strength types, saw falls which were similar to the close of the last Melb sale (1 week after the last Syd sale). 19.0 Micron saw falls of 20 c/kg cln and the 20-23 micron fell between 20-30 c/kg clean. Skirtings oddments & the XB remained firm on a small selection. 10.7% was passed in & top buyers were Chargeurs, Southern X, AS Gedge, Itochu & Schneider.

On Wednesday, Sydney had a larger offering of 10,956 bales with the better types remaining firm. The 19.0-20.0 fell by around 5 c/kg and the 22 microns fell a further 9c/kg. The only gains were recorded in the 17 & finer and the small selection of 24.0 Mic. The better length skirtings gained around 1% and the others remained firm. XB's were slightly cheaper and locks and crutchings remained unchanged. A higher pass in rate of 15.0% & top buyers were Southern X, Modiano, Itochu, Chargeurs, & Lempriere. Sydney Thursday offered 9,162 bales and the AUD was trading around 0.5cents higher than Wednesday which contributed to the market easing (also low levels of demand). 18-23 Microns fell 6-10 cent/kg clean. On a small positive note prices started to rise towards the end of the day. XB's & locks were 5c/kg cheaper and crutchings were generally unchanged. 13.2% was passed in & top buyers were BWK Elders, Modiano, Schneider, Chargeurs & Southern X.

Sales in Fremantle opened on Wednesday with 12,488 bales offered. Falls recorded were in line with the East with the finer end least affected. 19-21.5 fell 20c/kg cln and the broader types fell up to 30c/kg clean. Skirtings remained unchanged and locks & crutchings were 1% cheaper. A very high pass in rate of 24.3% & top buyers were PJ Morris, Norfolk Wool, Modiano, H Dawson & Itochu

On Thursday Fremantle offered 10,349 bales and similar falls to the East were again recorded (the AUD was trading around 0.5cents higher than Wednesday). The finer end was least affected however the 18.5-21.5 Microns fell 9-12 cent/kg clean. The finer skirtings remained unchanged and the 19-21 were cheaper. Locks & crutchings were 1% dearer. Pass in rates were lower than Wednesday at 26.5%. Major buyers were BWK Elders, PJ Morris, Lempriere, Itochu, Modiano and H Dawson.

Next week sales will be held in all three selling centres with just over 72,000 bales rostered for sale

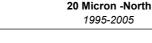
