#### NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -

Auction sales were held in Newcastle, Melbourne and Fremantle this week, with 57,000 bales on offer. Sales for the Northern Region were held in Newcastle this week and prices were generally cheaper when sales opened on Tuesday. 22 to 24 micron fleece wools were the most affected falling 10-20c/kg clean. Only 18 micron merino and the broader crossbred fleeces saw any positive movement, up around 5c/kg clean.

On Wednesday prices continued the downward trend with merino fleeces generally down 5c/kg clean, 18 micron the most affected down 20c/kg clean. On Wednesday the Australian dollar rose sharply, around 1c US during the day. After closing at less than 70c US on Monday the dollar finished at over 71c US on Wednesday night and remained over 71c US on Thursday. It is interesting to note that interest rates were raised 0.25% in Australia on Wednesday and the continued higher interest rates in Australia comparative to the US is likely to keep the Australian dollar at these current higher levels. Combined with continued uncertainty in buyer demand signs seem to indicate the market will remain sluggish, at least in the short term.


On Thursday prices were unchanged for 20 micron and broader fleece wools but 19 micron and finer fleeces were down 5c/kg clean. During the week better style fleece wools 38NKT and better were generally unchanged while less stylish weaker wools were generally cheaper.

For the week skirtings were slightly dearer; again longer, low VM types firmer whilst higher VM types were slightly cheaper. Crossbreds were generally unchanged on a small offerering considering sales were held in Newcastle. Locks and crutchings were 15-20c/kg cheaper over the week's sales.

Quotes on Macquarie Wool Futures closely followed movements in the Australian dollar this week, starting firmer on Monday and Tuesday before falling 15-20c/kg clean on Wednesday and unchanged on Thursday.

Sales continue in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.
