NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 76.76c US, as of 07/04/2005

Sales resumed in Melbourne and Sydney after a one week recess for Easter and Fremantle sales resumed after a two week recess. The national offering was much larger with approximately 74,000 bales this week, making it the second largest offering for the season. Sales in Sydney were held on Wednesday and Thursday, with the market opening very firm on Wednesday with prices increasing for all microns. Prices were generally 5c/kg clean dearer, with 18.5s and 20s seeing the biggest rise of around 12c/kg clean. Crossbreds were also around 5c/kg clean dearer. Merino skirtings were around 10c/kg clean dearer and there was good demand for cardings pushing prices up 15-20c/kg clean. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 6%.

The marke was firmer again on Thursday with prices rising slightly for 22 micron and finer by around 2-5c/kg clean. Crossbreds finished the day unchanged. Merino skirtings and cardings were well supported and finished the day unchanged. The passed-in rate for Thursday was 4%.


Major buyers in the Northern region for the week were Southern Cross Wool (2,300 bales), BWK Elders (1,962 bales) and Modiano (1,754 bales).

Wooltrade recorded some very good sales this week as well as over the Easter recess. A lot of the sales over Easter were due mainly to a weaker Australian dollar as it dropped below 78c US last week and then traded in a range of 76.3 to 76.8c US during this week. 19.5-21.5 fleece lots were the most sought after, with some very good premiums paid for 38nkt+ lots.

With the Reseve Bank unexpectedly keeping interest rates unchanged this week, there has been downward pressure on the Australian dollar. Bearing in mind that the dollar was threatening to break through 80c US just before Easter this is welcome news for woolgrowers. Some analysts are predicting the dollar could return to levels around 73-74c US which would help stimulate demand for wool here in Australia.

Sales continue next week in Sydney, Melbourne and Femantle. There will be another large offering next week with approximately 74,000 bales for sale nationally.
