NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -

There was a relatively large national offering of approximately 80,000 bales this week to begin the new season. There was also a substantial rise in the Australian dollar this week, and it seemed that it was these two influences which were the most significant in pushing down wool prices this week.


Markets opened in Sydney on Tuesday with prices falling across all microns. The heaviest falls were for 21 micron and broader, with prices 15-20c/kg clean cheaper. The finer end was less affected with prices falling around 10-15c/kg clean. The broader crossbreds also fell by around 5c/kg clean. Merino skirtings were generally unchanged and oddments were fully firm.

The dollar continued to rise on Wednesday and reached 72c US by the end of the day, compared to just under 69c US last week. This represented a rise of 4.5% against the US dollar in less than a week. However the market stabilised on Wednesday with a slight firming of prices. The was a more stylishing offering of finer wools on Wednesday which saw prices rise by around 5c/kg clean. All other microns were 2-5c/kg clean dearer, while skirtings and oddments were unchanged. Prices fell slightly on Thursday erasing the small gains made on Wednesday. Prices were generally 5c/kg clean cheaper for all fleece wools. Merino skirtings and oddments were unchanged. The passed-in rates for the week were all similar despite the heavy falls on Tuesday, averaging around 12 over the three days%.

The Southern region, together with the Western region, now enters a three week recess, however there is a sale in Sydney next week before recessing for three weeks. Opportunities for selling continue on Wooltrade however, and in recesses over the past 12 months Wooltrade has seen good sales with buyers taking advantage of potential falls in the dollar and looking to fill any short term orders.

Sales continue in Sydney next week and resume in Melbourne and Fremantle in the first week of August.


