NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 76.97 US as of 08/09/2005

Sales were held in Sydney, Melbourne and Femantle this week with a national offering of just under 54,000 bales. There were 15,715 bales offered in Sydney, with approximately 8.7% re offered wool.

With the Aussie dollar rising towards the end of last week, indications were for a softer market this week. The dollar was trading at around 77c US on Wednesday and Thursday, a rise of around 2c US (or 2.5%) since last Thursday. When sales opened in Sydney on Wednesday prices were around 15-20c/kg clean lower for 22 micron and finer. The broader end was less affected with prices around 5c/kg clean cheaper. Merino skirtings also finished the day recording falls of 10-15c/kg clean. Oddments were generally unchanged. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 18%.

There was better support on Thursday which saw prices hold firm. Prices were up to 5c/kg clean dearer for merino fleeces while the crossbreds were generally unchanged. The best support was for 19 microns. Merino skirtings and oddments remained unchanged. The passed-in rate for Thursday was 13%.

Chinese interest continues to dominate the market with the major buyers for the week in Sydney being Southern Cross Wool (1,426 bales), Morepen (1,371 bales) and Techwool (1,302 bales).

The markets in Melbourne and Fremantle followed a very similar pattern to Sydney this week, recording large falls on Wednesday then prices firming on Thursday.

According to reports from Woolmark, total Chinese imports of raw and semi-processed wool for the 2004-05 season were around 4% lower compared to the previous year. Wool imports from Australia, the largest contributor with around 70% of China's wool imports, fell by approximately 6% for the year. The highest figures were recorded during first seven months of 2005, but fell away during July. This is most likely due to the recent disputes over trade restrictions between China and the EU/USA which seem to be creating uncertainty for Chinese mills and their exports into these two key markets. With China such a dominant player in wool processing at the moment any slackening in demand flows directly to prices paid to growers. Unfortunately this demand has not been strong enough to boost prices in recent months, and combined with a stronger dollar prices have continued to fall.

Sales continue next week in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle with approximately 57,000 bales on offer nationally.

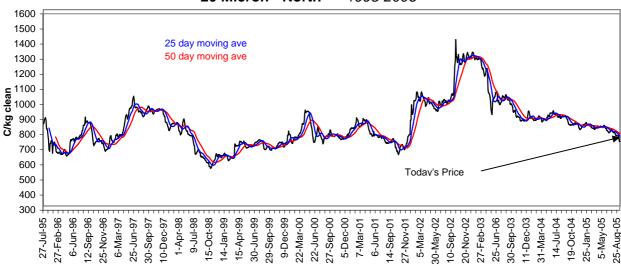
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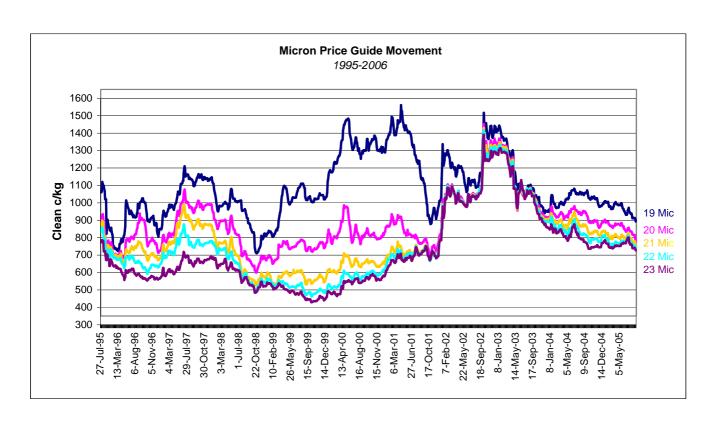
