NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 74.00 US as of 09/02/2006

Sales were held in Sydney, Launceston and Fremantle this week and the national offering was smaller, with only 48,500 bales, due to the Launceston sale. The offering in Sydney was13,898 bales, of which approximately 14% was re-offered wool.

Sales opened nationally in Launceston on Tuesday with an offering consisting mostly of oddments, bulk class and interlots. As a result fleece price comparisons with last week were not available but the good competition in the carding sector gave a preview of a strong market, prices finished the day 15-20c/kg clean higher. The passed-in rate for Tuesday was around 4%.

The market continued its upward rise when sales opened in Sydney on Wednesday. 18 microns and finer were up to 50c/kg clean dearer and received the most support. Competition was still very strong for medium and broader microns with prices closing around 25-30c/kg clean dearer compared to last week's closing quotes. Merino skirtings also performed well with most types 30-40c/kg clean dearer. Oddments were also stronger with prices around 10-15ckg clean dearer. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 5%. There was a slightly smaller offering on Thursday and the finer end was generally unchanged. 21-22 micron fleeces came under good competition and rose a further 5-10c/kg clean while the finer crossbreds rose 15c/kg clean. Merino skirtings and oddments closed the week generally unchanged. The passed-in rate for Thursday was approximately 6%. The major buyers for the week in Sydney were Modiano (1,675 bales), BWK Elders (1,130 bales), and AS Gedgel (1,053 bales).


In Launceston sales on Wednesday prices rose by 35-40c/kg clean for all microns with extreme competition on selected spinners. On Thursday prices stabilised with 20-21 microns up a further 5-10c/kg clean while other microns were unchanged. In Fremantle sales on Wednesday prices were around 15-30c/kg clean dearer across all microns while on Thursday 20-21 microns were a further 5c/kg clean dearer while other microns were unchanged.

Wooltrade again experienced a very busy week with just under 3,000 bales sold for the week as of 09/02/06, with buyer interest for all wool types. Growers in the South have benefited from using Wooltrade by having exposure to such a strong market despite there being no auction sales available due to the Launceston sale.

Next Week: Sales resume again next week in Melbourne while sales continue in Sydney and Fremantle. The market may be tested a little more next week with with a much larger offering of approximately 76,500 bales rostered for sale.

Wooltrade will continue to provide growers access to the market and growers can benefit from this constant market exposure, particularly with the current favourable market conditions (which may not last for the long term). 


