## NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 76.68 US as of 9/06/2005

Sales this week were held in Melbourne and Sydney with a national offering of 34,995 bales. The AUD was trading higher compared to last week around US.76.60 to 76.90 USc.

Sydney auctions opened on Wed with falls occurring in all microns, especially 21micron and finer. The 18 Micron quotes closed 20 cents easier at 1001, 19 micron at 903 (-11), 20 Mic at 800 (-15) and the 21-22 also falling by 10 cents. The better style, low VM Mer skirtings remained firm. Locks & crutchings were generally unchanged and their was the small offering of XB's remained firm. Pass in rates were high at 17.4% with major buyers - Southern Cross, Morpen, Chargeurs, Techwool, AS Gedge and Lempriere. On Thursday the Sydney market remained unchanged to Wednesday levels. The better styled low VM 19 and finer saw marginal increases. Mer Skirtings, crutchings, locks and XB's remained fully firm. Pass in rates were 14.1% and major buyers for the day were

Sales opened in Melbourne on Wednesday with falls occurring in all microns of around 1.5% compared with last Thursday (the AUD strengthened by 1.25% to 1.5%). The 18-18.5 Microns fell between 15-20 cents/kg clean. All other microns fell between 10-15 cents. The high Nkt lots were less affected. Skirtings also fell by up to 10c, XB's fell by 5-10 cents with little change in the oddments. Pass in rates were 15.4%.

Thursday saw smaller falls in most microns, especially low Nkt lots, with 18Mic & Finer Fleece falling 10-15 cents. Skirtings and XB's remained firm, with locks and crutchings 5 -10 cents easier. Pass in rates were similar to Wed at 15.8%. Major buyers for the week were Itochu, Kathaytex, Techwool, Williams Wool, Chargeurs, AS Gedge and Fox & Lillie.

There was no sale in Fremantle as they had a 1 week sale recess.

Southern Cross, AS Gedge, Modiano, Morpen, Chargeurs and Lempriere.

BWK Elders were again absent from the market in ALL selling centres for the third consecutive week.

Next week has 53,983 bales with Sydney, Melbourne & Freemantle all selling on Wednesday and Thursday.
