NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 73,29 US as of 10/11/2005

Sales were held in Melbourne and Femantle with a designated specialty fine wool sale held in Newcastle this week. The national offering was smaller this week with only approximately 49,000 bales. There were 14,409 bales offered in Newcastle of which approximately 4% was re-offered wool.

Sales opened nationally in Newcastle on Tuesday with the offering mainly consisting of good and best style wools. There was good competition on the limited volume of spinners but in general the market was 5c/kg clean easier for fleece wools. The better style skirtings were 5c/kg clean dearer while the remainder were unchanged. Locks were also unchanged while crutchings were up to 10c/kg clean dearer. The passed-in rate for Tuesday was 6%.

Wednesday's sale consisted of the best offering for the week with an improved volume of spinners which were up to 2% dearer. The lower style 16.5 micron and finer fleeces eased 1-2%, while the large volume of 17-20 microns remained unchanged. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was around 9%.

Thursday's offering was the poorest of the week and was reflected in a general easing of prices. The predominantly good style 16.5 micron fleeces were 2-3% lower while 17-20 microns were 5-10c/kg clean cheaper. The selected spinners types were very firm. Merino skirtings and oddments remained generally unchanged. The passed-in rate for Thursday was again around 11%.

The major buyers for the week in Newcastle were New England Wool (2,429 bales), G Schneider (2,278 bales) and Chargeurs (1,300 bales).

Prices in Melbourne were generally 5-10c/kg clean cheaper on Wednesday with the broader end most affected. On Thursday prices were generally 3c/kg clean dearer for most microns. In Fremantle sales on Wednesday the broader end was unchanged while the finer end fell 10-15c/kg clean. On Thursday the market steadied and prices were generally unchanged.

Wooltrade recorded its highest ever price this week for a single bale of shedded 13.1 micron OFDA ultrafine wool. The buyer was M A Kiernan & Co who paid a record 27,663c/kg clean (20,000c/kg greasy). M A Kiernan & Co also purchased 2 bales of 13.8 micron OFDA ultrafine wool for 11,996c/kg clean and 11,832c/kg clean respectively (8,649c/kg greasy). The wool, offered on behalf of New Zealand Merino Co and stored in Melbourne, is bound for Northern Italy where it will be made into tops for weavers of ultrafine cloth.

Sales continue next week in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle. The national offering will be significantly larger next week with only approximately 71,000 bales rostered for sale.

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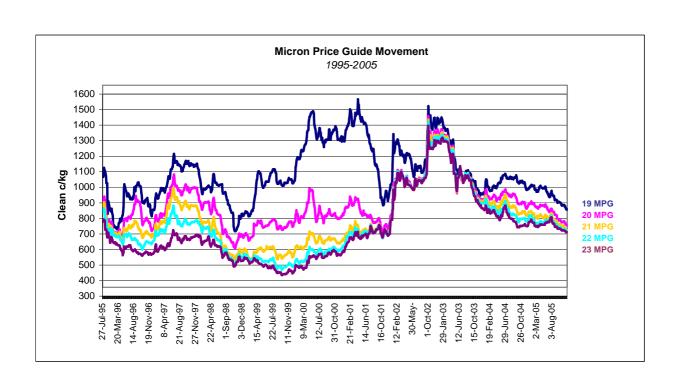
