NORTHERN MARKET REPORT

Sales were held in Melbourne and Fremantle this week, with a specialty fine wool sale held in Newcsastle. The national offering was approximately 52,000 bales.

The specialty fine wool sale in Newcastle was relatively small with only approximately 15,000 bales on offer over the week. There was only a small selection on Tuesday, with premiums paid for the few spinners, but prices were generally 2-3% lower than the previous Newcastle sale.

Prices for the best-style types opened firmer on Wednesday, due mainly to a more stylish selection. Spinners gained good support and were 2-3% dearer, while lower style, lower nkt types were unchanged. The strongest demand was for 17.5-18.5 microns.

The best offering was on Thursday with further gains for Spinners and Best types of around 2%. A limited offering of 19-21 microns remained unchagned. Schneiders was the dominant buyer in Newcastle this week with other major buyers being Lempriere, New England and Itochu. Passed-in rates for the week averaged around 7%.

Auction sales in Melbourne this week showed solid support for the broader end with other microns remaining slightly firmer. 22-24 microns showed the biggest movements on Thursday with increases of 10-15c/kg clean. Skirtings were also well supported rising around 15c/kg clean for the week.

The market continues to remaiin firm and seems to have found a level of the past few weeks. This is particularly encouraging considering the strength of the dollar against the USD recently, and given that prices paid in USD by mills in China have increased. Any downward movements in the dollar may translate to a push in prices in the short-term. Next week sales continue in Sydnety, Melbourne and Fremantle.


