#### **NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -**

#### Australian Dollar 75.2 US as of 13/10/2005

Sales were held in Sydney, Melbourne and Femantle this week. The national offering this week was approximately 55,000 bales. There were 16,652 bales offered in Sydney. Around 8% of the offering was re-offered wool. Sales opened in Sydney on Wednesday and the market was generally firmer with only small movements in price. 19 and 21 microns were around 5c/kg clean dearer while other microns were up to 2c/kg clean dearer. Crossbreds also remained firm. Merino skirtings and oddments finished the day generally unchanged. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 7%.

The market was slightly firmer again on Thursday on the back of good buyer competition. 18-22 microns all recorded small gains of up to 3c/kg clean. Crossbreds finished the week slightly dearer, with 30 microns the most affected rising 2c/kg clean. The passed-in rate for Thursday was quite low at around 4%.

The major buyers for the week in Sydney were Techwool (1,735 bales), Southern Cross Wool (1,560 bales) and Morepen (1,500 bales).

In the Melbourne sale this week prices were generally unchanged on Wednesday with the only movement being for 20-21 microns which were 5c/kg clean dearer. On Thursday prices. In Fremantle sales this week prices were firmer on Wednesdayby 5c/kg clean for 20 microns and broader while the finer end was unchanged. Prices remained firm on Thursday.

In some encouraging news, China's Customs Bureau reports that China's imports of raw and semi-processed wool for the first eight months of 2005 are 7% higher than for the same period last year. This is despite the impact of the trade restrictions of China's exported apparel products into the EU and the USA. Woolmark reports that Chinese manufacturers have limited their purchases of wool in recent months in response to an anticipated slowdown in demand for Chinese textiles. This has the likely effect of encouraging Chinese mills to operate on a hand to mouth basis even further.

Movements in the Australian dollar seem to be having a reduced impact on wool prices in the last month or two. Australian exporters report that the Chinese are now very quick to lower their prices in repsonse to any downward movement in the Australian dollar. And with passed-in rates remaining low across the country at the moment there is very little upward pressure for wool prices. Without any changes in these supply/demand fundamentals, and a consistent Australian dollar, the short-term outlook for prices seems to be stable at these price levels.

Sales continue next week in Melbourne and Fremantle with a specialty fine wool sale in Newcastle. The national offering will be slightly larger next week with approximately 63,000 bales rostered for sale.

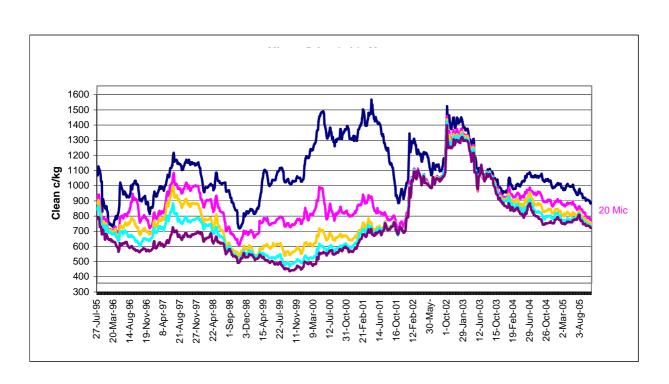
