NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -

Auction sales were held in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle this week, with 65,000 bales on offer. Sales for the Northern Region were held in Sydney this week after Newcastle sales last week. Again wool prices fell across the board this week. Prices were down 20-30c/kg clean for the finer merino fleece wools in comparison to the Newcastle offering. 21 micron and broader fleece wools fell around 10c/kg clean. Merino skirtings were 20-25c/kg clean cheaper while crossbreds were around 10c/kg clean cheaper.


On Wednesday prices continued to drift on Wednesday with merino fleece wools around 5c/kg clean down on Tuesday's closing prices. Skirtings and oddments were generally unchanged to slightly firmer.

The market did not perform any better on Thursday with the broader merion fleece wools falling around 10c/kg clean while the finer end was down around 5c/kg clean. Skirtings and oddments were down 10-15c/kg clean and crossbreds also fell 10-15c/kg clean. Passed-in rates for the week were again relatively low, averaging around 15%, despite wool prices continuing to fall.

Wool prices have continued to fall in recent weeks amid sluggish buyer demand and the ever increasing strength of the Australian dollar. In the short-term at least there are no signs of relief for woolgrowers as uncertainty continues to surround buyer demand. The graph below displaying the falling 21 micron price guide for the Southern region in comparison to the rising Australia illustrates just what effect the strengthing dollar seems to be having on wool prices. It remains to be seen when the market will begin to show signs of finding a floor in prices.

Sales continue next week in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle.
