NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 73.87 US as of 16/02/2006

Sales were held in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle this week and the national offering was rather large with 74,658 bales offered. Sales opened nationally in Melbourne on Tuesday. Compared to last weeks very good selection, the finer end retreated 5-10cents, with the 17.0 mic falling 14 cents. Skirtings aloso eased by around 5-6 cents. A good selection of XB's resulted in a rise of 10-18 cents. The pass in rate

On Wednesday Melbourne had 10,109 bales offered with the strongest support in the 18-19.0 micron types which recorded 6-12 cent gains. The 19.5-21.0 micron fell 6-8 cents. 26 microns rose 10 cents. Skirtings remained unchanged with bellies receiving the strongest support. Locks remainded in sellers favour and crutchings were 5 cents dearer. 3.9% was passed in.

There was a larger offering on Thursday of nearly 12,000 bales which saw mixed mixed results. 18.0 & finer rose 4-8 cents, 18.5 fell 5 cents, 19.5 to 21.0 mic roses 3-6 cents, 22-23.0 fell marginally and samll increase were recorded in the 24-28 micron area.

The skirtings closed firmer with good support on the better types. Locks traded 5-10 cents firmer and crutchings remained firm. The pass in rate for Thursday was 6.3%. The major buyers for the week in Melbourne were Kathaytex, Itochu, BWK Elders, Techwool & Schneider


In Sydney sales on Wednesday prices rose by 10c/kg for 18.5 micron and small increases of 3-5 cents were seen in the 18.0, 19.0-20 mic and other types remained firm. Skirtings and XB's remained firm. Washing locks fell slightly, carbo locks firm and crutchings rose 5-10 cents. On Thursday Sydney was similar to Melb with mixed results. Small gains were recorded in 18.5-19.0 mic, 19.5 fell marginally and other types were firm. Skirtings were strong for types below 5% VM wand small falls in the higher VM types. XB stayed firm, locks unchanged and washing crutchings eased slightly.

In Fremantle on Wednesday prices were slightly cheaper with the biggest falls recoorded in the 21-22 mic whic fell 3-6 cents. Skirtings fell 5-10 cents. Washing locks fell 5-10 cents, carbo locks and crutchings fell 5 cents. On Thursday Freemantle had 10-12 cent rises in the 19-20.0 mic types and others remained unchanged. Skirtings fell 10 cents, locks and crutchings rose 5-10 cents.






