NORTHERN MARKET REPORT (14/09/04)

This week Melbourne had a three day sale while there were two day sales in Sydney and Fremantle. The national offering this week was approximately 64,000 bales.


Sales opened nationaly in Melbourne on Tuesday and there were only small movements as the Australian dollar rose above 70cUS. 19 micron and finer fleeces were slightly firmer with good support for the better style 40nkt+ lots. There was also good support for 20 and 21 microns which were around 5c/kg clean dearer. The broader end drifted slightly lower. Merino skirtings were 5c/kg clean lower while oddments were around 10c/kg clean cheaper. Another small New Zealand catalogue was offered on Tuesday with around 32% passed-in. In Sydney on Wednesday the fine end made solid gains with strong demand for better style 40nkt+ lots. All broader microns closed slightly lower compared to last sale. Merino skirtings remained generally unchanged while oddments were around 10c/kg clean dearer.

Prices were generally lower on Thursday with 18 and 20 micron the most affected falling around 7c/kg clean. All other microns fell around 2-4c/kg clean. Merino skirtings and oddments remained unchanged. Passed-in rates for the week averaged around 11%.

It is interesting to note that the latest AWTA statistics show that there has been an increase of 9.5% in the number of bales tested so far this season in comparison to the same period last year. This is significantly higher than the forecast figure of 4% predicted for the 2004/05 season.

Sales continue in Newcastle, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.
