MARKET REPORT AND OUTLOOK:


After a dramatic lift in prices last week, the market again witnessed a further extreme jump in levels on Wednesday in both the Northern and Southern auction markets (anyone with an eye on the futures market would have seen a dramatic lift in futures prices Monday/Tuesday). After jumps of 80-100c/kg clean on Wednesday, the market correct a little on Thursday for the broader types 23-24 micron but remained fully firm on other types. Superfines continue to rise, and some prices for 15.0-16.5 traded on Wooltrade were to extreme, reaching prices near highs set nearly 12 months ago. Most affected are the better style sound wools, free of fault. The Northern market retraced further than the South on Thursday, but in effect only to come back in lines with the price quotes out of the Southern market. No Western market this week, but sales reflecting the higher prices of the East were made through Wooltrade.

Skirtings prices also increased up to 8%, whilst carding wools continue to trade at levels not seen in the past 8 years, clean prices now in excess of 615/kg.

The squeeze on supply is having its obvious effects on price. Lack of supply together with increased demand from Western Europe and Japan have pushed prices to extreme levels. A small correction is likely as buyers reassess, however, the lack of supply will continue to put pressure on prices in the short/medium term. With price hikes of the last week, many growers holding stock have sold or have booked wool into auction for next week. Next week's auction volumes are nearing 100,000 nationally and will put some pressure on the market. If this were to occur however, a decline in price by 30-40c/kg is likely to see China re-enter the market and provide a pseudo floor price against prices falling too far.

Figure 1: Northern MPG Movement




