The auction market this week opened on a cheaper note owing to larger volumes of better type wools on offer. Tuesday and Wednesday saw 19 micron and finer loose up to 20c/kg clean, medium types up to 10c/kg clean cheaper and the broader types 22-25micron down by 25c/kg clean. Thursday saw some demand re-enter the market with mediums and broads rising by about 7c/kg clean. Fine wools continued to slump though, losing a further 10c/kg clean.

Better type, low VM skirtings remained fully firm for the week, while higher VM types were up to 2% cheaper.

Cardings closed slightly cheaper for the week, washing locks and better style carbo locks slightly dearer.

Many articles in the popular press media published this week have given mixed opinion as to the direction of the market. It is no secret that supply is a key factor in the equation, with the annual production for this year forecast to be about 500m kilos. A simple view of demand/supply would predict this under supply would auger well for prices. However, from a processing point of view, prices being paid for raw wool currently have early-stage processors running at a loss unable, to on-sell to their customers. Lack of supply at a sustainable and competitive price may promote fibre substitution amongst mills.

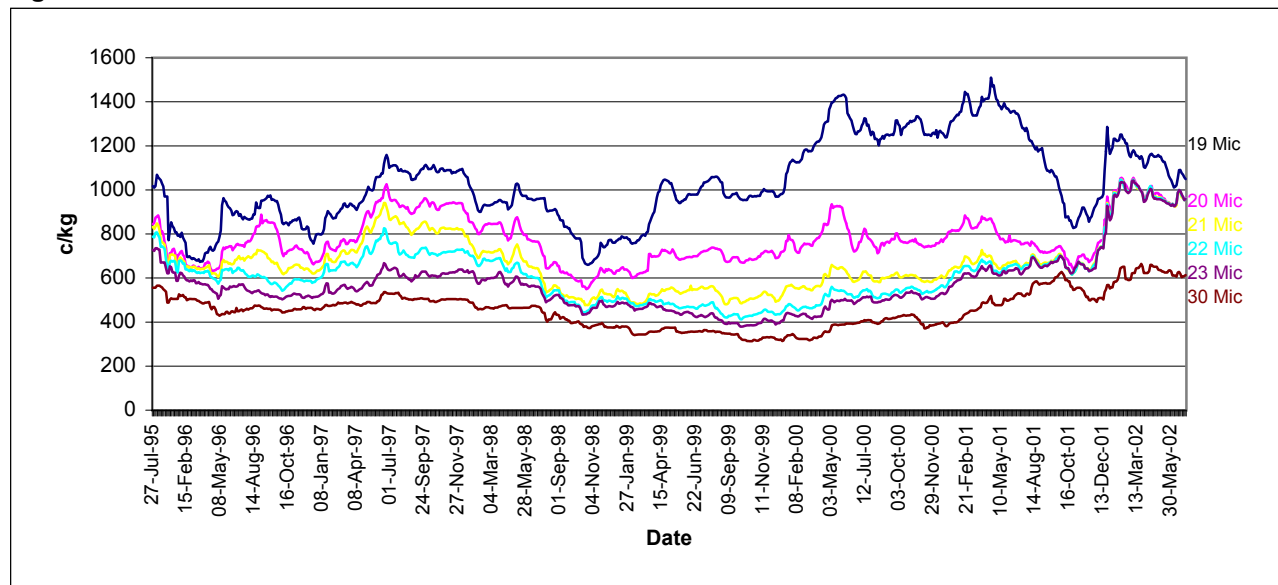
Production figures were forecast for 2002/03 - New South Wales down 5% with cut per head to average 5kg.

Queensland - down 14% with cut per head down 0.5kg to 4.5kg.

Despite a decline in the market early in the week, Macquarie Wool Futures remained generally unchanged for the week. The gap between in prices for the current and forward months in Spring for medium wool is only about 25c/kg below - the smallest gap seen yet.

Figure 1: Northern MPG Movement





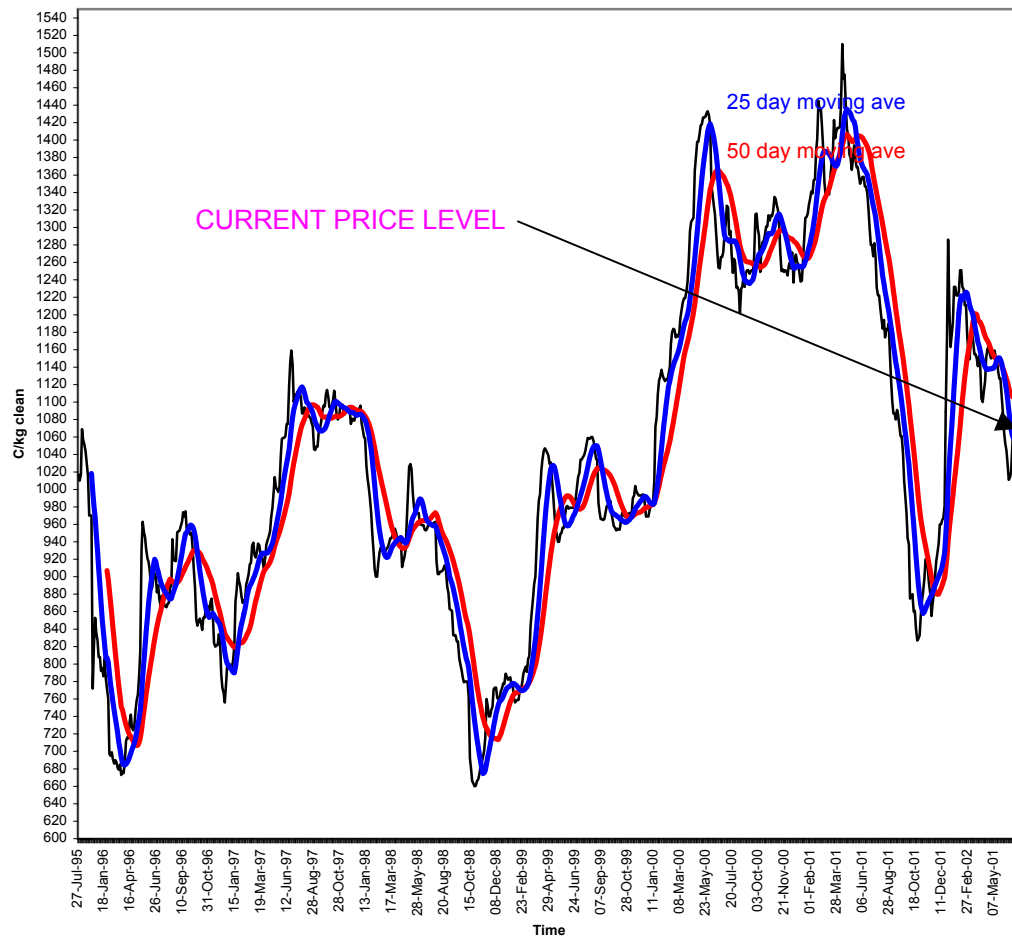
