#### NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -

Auction sales were held in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle this week, with approximately 50,000 bales on offer. Sales for the Northern Region opened in Sydney on Tuesday. In welcome news for woolgrowers wool prices opened opened generally higher. Prices were up 5-15c/kg clean for all merino fleece wools and merino skirtings and oddments were up around 10c/kg clean also. Crossbred prices were 10-15c/kg clean highter.

On Wednesday the market generally held the ground made on Tuesday, with the finer merino fleece prices falling around 5c/kg clean while the broader merino fleece prices were unchanged. Broader crossbred fleeces were 5-10c/kg dearer. Merino skirtings and oddments were down 5-10c/kg clean for the day.


Prices for merino fleeces were generally unchanged to slightly cheaper on both Wednesday and Thursday. Crossbreds also ended generally unchanged while merino skirtings and oddments were slightly cheaper. It was evident in sales this week that fleece wools with a mid break of >70 were heavily discounted.

It is encouraging to note that the general improvement in the market has occurred this week despite the Australian dollar rising further against the US dollar. The Australian dollar is now at six year highs, remaining above 72c US for most of the week and with analysts predicting the dollar to continue to perform well against the US dollar this will continue to put downward pressure on wool prices.

The falls over the past several weeks have resulted in wool prices returning closer to long term price averages after the relatively high prices at the start of 2003, and after prices stabilised in sales this week the market may be starting to find a base level again. Macquarie Wool Futures quotes followed a similar trend to the physical market this week. Quotes were around 10c/kg clean dearer on Monday, remained unchanged on Tuesday before easing 5c/kg clean on Wednesday and Thursday.

Sales continue next week in Newcastle, Melbourne and Fremantle.


