## NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 77.46c US, as of 21/04/2005

Sales this week were held in Melbourne, Sydney and Fremantle. The national offering was slightly smaller this week at approximately 68,000 bales.

Although there were no big movements in prices this week, the market ended up slightly cheaper compared to last week's closing quotes. Demand continues to be a little flat with no clear market direction, as has been the case for much of this season. It is interesting to note that in the latest Woolmark Bulletin that the latest data from AWTA indicates that growers stocks held in brokers stores around Australia continue to increase slightly. And this is despite the higher offerings and good clearances seen in the past month or two. The figures for the end of March 2005 show that an additional 79,000 bales are held in-store compared to March 2004, and compared to the beginning of this season in-store have increased by 213,000 bales. Approximately 600,000 bales around held in-store Australia-wide.

There were no sales in Sydney on Tuesday, but in Melbourne sales there was very little movement in prices, 24 microns finishing up 6c/kg clean while all other microns were generally unchanged. Merino skirtings were also unchanged and oddments ended the day around 5c/kg clean cheaper. The passed-in rate for Tuesday was 7%.

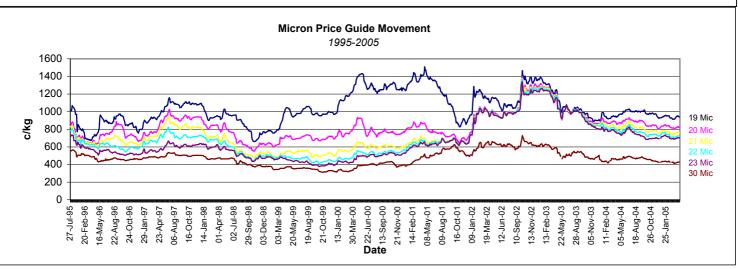
In Sydney on Wednesday the finer end was very firm and there was very little movement in prices for 19.5 micron and broader. Merino skirtings were very firm with good demand for better style, low vm lots. The oddments were generally unchanged. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 8%.

The market generally eased slightly on Thursday, again with only small movements in prices. There was good support for 18.5 microns which saw prices rise around 10c/kg clean. Merino skirtings and oddments remained firm. The passed-in rate for Thursday was much higher at 11%.

Interest from China has dominated buyer demand recently and the major buyers in Sydney this week were BWK Elders (2,241 bales), AS Gedge (1,538 bales) and Modiano (1,386 bales).

Auction sales continue next week in Sydney, Melbourne and Femantle. With a much smaller offering next week (only approximately 53,000 bales for sale nationally) and hopefully a stable dollar we should see prices remain firm next week.

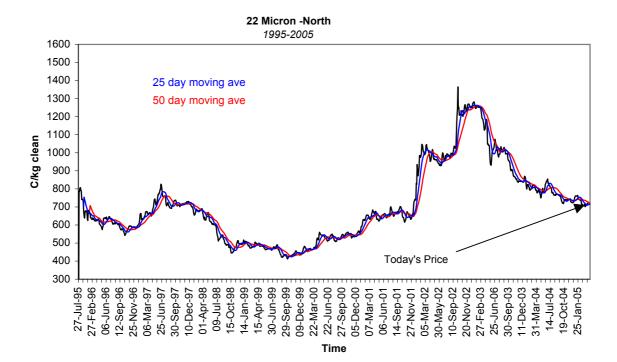
