NORTHERN MARKET REPORT

Sales were held in Melbourne, Fremantle and a specialty fine wool sale in Newcastle this week. The nationally offering was approximately 53,000 bales.

There were no sales in Sydney this week with sales held in Newcastle. Prices compared to last week's closing quotes were generally unchanged for lower styles and lower nkt lots when sales opened on Tuesday. Better style higher nkt lots were 10-15c/kg clean dearer compared to Sydney. With the best selection of the week selling on Tuesday a small number of spinners attracted large premiums. Despite this prices for 16-17 microns were 50-100c/kg clean lower when compared to the last Newcastle sale.


Prices for 16.5 micron and finer spinners were 20-30c/kg easier on Wednesday, while prices for better style lots 17-19 microns remained firm.

There was only a small offering on Thursday with prices for spinners remaining firm. 19-19.5 micron better style lots were around 10c/kg clean easier. Passed-in rates for the week averaged around 8%.

In the Melbourne this week the market continued to drift sideways with only small movements in either direction on any given day. 20-23 micron fleece prices were around 5-10c/kg clean dearer for the week. Another relatively small offering nationally probably helped stabilise prices, and it will be interesting to guage the market next week when the national offering rises to around 69,000 bales. The past three weeks have seen a steadier market with prices levelling out after several weeks of falling prices. Orders from overseas mills continue to be predominantly short-term, giving little indications of what the market may do in the next few months.

Sales continue in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.


