NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -

Auction sales were held in Sydney, Fremantle and Melbourne this week after a two week recess for Easter. There was another relatively large offering this week of approximately 72,500 bales nation-wide.


Sales opened in Sydney on Tuesday and prices were trading at similar levels for most microns in comparison to the last sale prior to Easter. 20 to 21 micron fleeces did rise by around 10c/kg clean while other microns, including crossbred fleeces, were generally unchanged. Merino skirtings were also generally unchanged.

A fall in the Australian dollar overnight seemed to trigger some increase in demand on Wednesday with prices rising around 10c/kg clean across all microns. Higher vm merino skirtings were 10-20c/kg cheaper while the lower vm lots traded at similar levels to Tuesday. On Thursday prices for the finer fleeces rose around 10-15c/kg clean, while the broader end remained unchanged. There was high demand for 28 micron crossbred fleeces on Thursday with prices rising 30c/kg clean. Merino skirtings were generally unchanged with higher vm lots around 5-10c/kg clean lower. Passed-in rates for the week were around 10-15%.

The stronger demand and the rise in prices after the Easter break are welcome news to woolgrowers. There were some strong sales achieved on Wooltrade over the recess and these were matched by prices seen in aucton on Wednesday and Thursday. It is interesting to note that there were solid premiums being paid for better style lots with high nkt on Thursday. It is also interesting to note the trend this year of the price gap between 19 and 20 micron continue to widen. Despite this, 21 micron and broader fleece prices continue to trade in the top 30% of all prices over the last 10 years. Good hedging opportunities still exist for woolgrowers with Macquarie Wool Futures quotes also rising in line with the spot market this week.

Sales continue in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.


