## **NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -**

## Australian Dollar 77.75 US as of 23/06/2005

Sales this week were held in Melbourne and Sydney with Fremantle having a one week recess. The national offering was only 27,000 bales.

This week saw the relatively good performance of the broader end continue. The standouts for the week were 21-23 microns which were around 5-15c/kg clean dearer while the finer end was unchanged to slightly cheaper.

A higher dollar early in the week saw prices ease marginally when sales opened in Sydney on Wednesday. 21 micron and finer were the most affected falling around 5-10c/kg clean. There was little movement in the broader microns with prices generally firm, however crossbreds were around 5c/kg clean cheaper. Merino skirtings were easier, especially high vm lots which were around 10c/kg clean cheaper, while oddments fell across the board and were around 10c/kg clean cheaper. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 15%.

There were some gains made for 20-23 microns on Thursday with prices finishing around 5-15c/kg clean higher. All other microns were generally unchanged. Merino skirtings and oddments were generally unchanged. The passed-in rate for Thursday was around 9%. China interests continued to dominate the market with the major buyers for the week in Sydney Southern Cross Wool (1,175 bales), Charguers (1,139 bales) and Techwool (1,119 bales). Lack of supply would have to be the major reason for the broader end rising this week, especially considering the dollar was firmer. 21 microns and broader continue to trade above the 10yr average and represent the best selling opportunities in the market at the moment. It is also interesting to note just how narrow the trading range for 21-23 microns is currently. The difference between 21s and 23s is only 21c/kg clean. The last time they were trading in such a tight band was back in the middle of 2003.

Wooltrade also had a solid week of sales with most interest being shown in 20-22 microns. With the break in sales occurring early in the new financial year, any growers looking to sell in July must consider listing on Wooltrade to take advantage of any selling opportunities during the recess.

Sales continue next week in Melbourne, Sydney and Fremantle. The national offering for next week will be significantly larger at approximately 51,000 bales.
