NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 76.22 US as of 24/08/2006

On Wednesday Melbourne had 9,815 bales on offer (1,129 bales or 11.5% were reoffered lots). Prices for 18.5-19 mic rose slightly, 19.5, 21 & 22 mic fell 2 cents, 23 mic rose 2 cents and 24 & 26 mic fell marginally. The crossbreds also remained unchanged. The finer lower vm merino skirtings closed firmer and all others unchanged. The washing locks and crutchings fell 8 cents. Passed in rate: 11.7%. Major Buyers: Itochu, Chargeurs, AS Gedge, Fox & Lillie & Kathaytex

Melbourne had 12,710 bales offered on Thursday with 13.6% or 1,729 reoffered bales. The market opened firm. The 18 to 18.5 mic rose 3 to 5 cents, 19-19.5 rose 8 to 10 cents, 20.0 mic rose 4 cents and most others remained firm. Merino skirts 19-21 mic fell 14-17 cents with other types remaining firm. XB fleece fell slightly on a limited offering. Locks were slightly cheaper and crutchings were unchanged. Passed in rate: 11.7%. Major Buyers: Itochu, Kathaytex, Chargeurs, AS Gedge & Modiano

The first Newcastle sale of the season opened on Tuesday with 7,266 bales offered (312 or 4.3% were reoffered lots). The market opened firm with a limited selection of spinners types. The 16 to 18.5 mic rose 4 to 8 cents, 19mic fell 5 cents, 20 mic fell 2 cents and 21 to 22 mic were slightly firmer. The finer bore stylish skirts to 19.5 mic rose slightly and others remained firm. A small offering of XB flc saw them fall slightly. Locks and crutchings remained firm. Passed in rate: 5.1%. Major Buyers: Techwool, Chargeurs, New England, AS Gedge and Elders Top Line.

Newcastle on Wednesday had 4,867 bales offered (306 or 6.3% were reoffered lots). The market opened firm with much most microns closing on a similar note. The 16.0 to 17.0 micron fleece which rose 5 cents, 17.5 fell slightly and others stayed firm. The finer more stylish skirts from 17.0 to 21 mic rose 5 cents and others remained firm. The finer locks rose 10 cents and others were unchanged. Crutchings also closed firm. **Passed in rate:** 9.4%. **Major Buyers:** Chargeurs, Elders Top Line, Southern Cross, AS Gedge and New England.

On Thursday the Newcastle market closed fully firm to slightly dearer. There were 5,602 bales on offer (134 bales or 2.4% were reoffered lots). Prices for 16.5-17.5 fleece rose 8-12 cents, the 18 to 18.5 rose 3 cents and others remained firm. Merino skirtings closed 10 dearer for the best lines while oddments were slightly firmer. The 28.0 crossbreds remained unchanged. Passed in rate: 3.1%. Major Buyers: New England, AS Gedge, Techwool, Southern Cross & Lempriere.


In Fremantle on Wednesday there were 6,277 bales offered (608 bales or 9.7% were reoffered lots). The market opened firm and closed with 18.5 rising 10 cents, 19 to 19.5 rose 6 cents and 20 to 21 rose 2-3 cents. The finer skirts were slightly firmer and others remained firm. Washing locks fell marginally and crutching were 6 cents dearer. Carbo locks remained firm. Passed in rate: 9.6% Major Buyers: BWK Elders, PJ Morris, H Dawson, Modiano & Startoy

Fremantle on Thursday had 5,262 bales offered (1,000 bales or 19% were reoffered lots). The market opened firm with 19 to 20 micron fleeces rising slightly, and the 21 microns rose 4 cents. The finer skirts were 6-8 cents firmer with others rising slightly. Washing and carbo locks were firmer. Crutchings were unchanged. Passed in rate: 19.4%. Major Buyers: PJ Morris, BWK Elders, Grain Corp, H Dawson and Modiano.

Next Week: Sales in Melbourne on Tuesday to Thursday, there are two day sales in Sydbney & Fremantle with 58,000 bales rostered nationally.

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




