NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT

Auction sales were again held in Sydney, Fremantle and Melbourne this week with an offering of approximately 71,000 bales nation-wide


Sales opened in Sydney on Tuesday and prices were lower for all merino fleeces. 22 micron and broader were around 10c/kg clean lower while the finer end was only 5c/kg clean lower. Prices for merino skirtings came off about 10c/kg clean, lots with colour, cott or high vm were most affected. Oddments and crossbred fleece prices were generally unchanged. The broader merino fleeces continued to fall on Wednesday with 21/22 microns the most affected falling 13.c/kg clean. Other merino fleece prices were around 5c/kg clean. Better style merino skirtings were unchanged while high vm lots were 5-10c/kg clean lower. Crossbred fleece prices were unchanged on Wednesday.

The market remained generally unchanged on Thursday. 18-19 micron fleece prices rose around 10c/kg clean while all other microns remained at similar prices to Wednesday. Crossbred prices were slightly dearer by 5c/kg clean. Merino skirtings were around 5c/kg clean dearer while oddments were unchanged. Passed-in rates for Sydney averaged around 15% for the week.

Despite price falls this week better style, sound types continued to attract demand from buyers and prices remained relatively unchanged. Another reason for the sluggish market this week might be the national offering next week, which is around 90,000 bales making it is the largest sale this season.

Sales continue in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.
