NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -

The market was weaker again this week. Last week the sales were in Newcastle with an emphasis on better quality fine wools. Therefore it was not unexpected that prices would open lower in Sydney on Tuesday in comparison to last week. However prices opened considerably lower, generally all merino fleece wool prices dropped between 30-50 c/kg clean on Tuesday. Merino skirtings and oddments were down 20-30 c/kg and crossbreds were 30-50 c/kg cheaper. By the close of sales on Tuesday the previously large price differential between the Northern and Southern markets had been eroded, in fact the North closed lower on Tuesday than the previous Southern final prices.


On Wednesday prices were slightly lower. 21 micron and finer fleece wools were down 5 c/kg clean, 22/23 micron were down 10 c/kg clean. 26 micron fleece wools continued to fall a further 26 c/kg clean on Thursday. It is interesting to note that the midbroader micron wool prices have recently continued to fall further than finer wool prices. Over the past few weeks the difference in price between broader and finer wools has widened, bringing an end to the situation of very little price discrimation that has existed during the past 12 months. On Wednesday merino skirtings and oddments were around 1% cheaper and crossbreds were down 10-20 c/kg clean.

The market was unchanged to slightly firmer on Thursday with only 23/25 micron fleece wool falling around 10c/kg clean, indicating more buyer interest at these lower price levels. On Wednesday night the AUD was down slightly from earlier in the week to 67.5c US, and by the close of sales on Thursday it was back over 68c US. It is worth keeping in mind that even at the start of April this year the AUD was at the 60c US level, making a large difference in the export price of our wool to overseas buyers. Indications on Thursday were that there is more buying interest from China at this week's price levels.

Macquarie wool futures followed a similar pattern to the physical market this week. Quotes were down 20c/kg clean on Monday and a further 5c on Tuesday, then remained unchanged for the rest of the week.

Sales continue in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.


