
The market this week saw wool prices fall across the board after experiencing price rises in recent weeks. On Wednesday merino fleece prices fell across all microns with the exception of 20 micron fleece wools which rose 5 c/kg clean. All other microns for merino fleece wools fell up to 20 c/kg clean. Again better style wools, 40 nkt and better were less affected. Merino skirtings were generally unchanged on Wednesday, while oddments were up to 1% cheaper. 28 micron and finer crossbred fleece wools were around 1% cheaper and 29 micron and broader crossbred fleece wools were up to 3% cheaper. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 16%.

On Thursday prices fell a similar amount. Merino fleece wools 23 micron and finer fell between 10-25 c/kg clean, while 24 micron and broader merino fleece wools were unchanged to 10 c/kg clean cheaper. Merino skirtings were around 1% cheaper, crutchings were 2-3% cheaper and locks up to 5% cheaper. Crossbred fleece prices were unchanged to 1% cheaper. The passed-in rate for Thursday was 29%.

Wool futures prices were also down this week, with Macquarie Wool Futures quotes falling 35-45 c/kg clean between Monday and Thursday. It is worth noting that in auctions on Thursday, prices did taper a considerable amount late in the day. This combined with a relatively large offering next week of 75,000 bales nationally would indicate that there will be continued downward pressure on prices next week. China continues to remains guiet despite rumours of new activity.

Sales continue next week in Fremantle, Sydney and Melbourne.


