NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 74.19 US as of 27/04/2006

Sales resumed after the Easter Recess in all centres with just over 71,000 bales rostered.

Melbourne opened on Wednesday with 12,535 bales offered. (Includes 12.6% or 1579 bls re-offered). All categories experienced falls with the Sth indicator closing 10 cents (clean) cheaper. The 18-20 micron fleece fell 7-10 cents, 21-22 mic fell 12-15 cents and 23-24 mic falling around 20 cents. Skirtings fell around 10- 12 cents with XB's losing close to five cents. Crutchings were the only type to record a rise and closed slightly firmer. Locks were in buyers favour. Passed in Rate: 22.8% Major Buyers: Quality Wool, AS Gedge, Williams, Chargeurs & Fox & Lillie.

The Sydney market resumed on Wednesday with 9,203 bales offered. (Includes 19.1% or 1758 bls re-offered). All categories experienced falls with the Nth indicator closing 12 cents (clean) cheaper. The 18 mic and finer fell 5 cents, 19-21 micron fleece fell 15-20 cents, 22-23 mic fell close to 25 cents and the 24 mic fell 13 cents. XB fleece 28-30 micron fell marginally. Skirtings fell around 20 cents for 19mic and finer. The coarser skirts fell 10-12 cents. Washing locks and crutchings remained firm. The carbo types fell 10 cents for the 19 mic & finer and the broader types fell by as much as 20 cents. Passed in Rate: 28% Major Buyers: Morpen, AS Gedge, BWK Elders, Michell & Southern Cross.

Fremantle opened on Wednesday with 9,380 bales offered. (Includes 8.6% or 800 bls re-offered). Just over 900 bls were withdrawn prior to sale. All categories experienced falls with the West Nth indicator closing 12 cents (clean) cheaper. The 19 mic fleece fell 11 cents, 19.5-20mic fell 15 cents, 20.5-22.5 mic fell close to 20 cents, 23 mic fell 15 cents and 24 and broader fell 20 cents. Skirtings fell around 8 to 10 cents for the lower VM types and up to 18 cents for lots with 5%VM. Washing locks and crutchings remained firm. The carbo types fell 5 cents. Passed in Rate: 28.0% Major Buyers: PJ Morris, BWK Elders, H Dawson, Modiano & Chargeurs

Melbourne opened on Thursday with 11,673 bales offered. (Includes 13.7% or 1599 bls re-offered). Most categories experienced falls with the Sth indicator closing 3 cents (clean) cheaper. The 18.5 mic fleece fell 10 cents, 19-21 fell 2-4 cents, 22 mic fell 10 cents and 23-25 mic fell 2-5 cents. Skirtings remained firm except some better fine lots which were slightly dearer. XB's remained firm on a limited selection. Crutchings fell 5-10 cents and locks fell 10-20 cents. Passed in Rate: 19.1% Major Buyers: Fox & Lillie, Itochu, AS Gedge, Williams & Kathaytex.

The Sydney opened on Thursday with 6,973 bales offered. (Includes 17.2% or 1199 bls re-offered). Passed in Rate: 11.2% Major Buyers: AS Gedge, Southern Cross, BWK Elders, itochu & Morpen.

Fremantle opened on Thursday with 13,186 bales offered. (Includes 25.8% or 3,401 bls re-offered). Most merino fleece types closed slightly cheaper except the 19.5 fleece which closed 5 cents firmer. Skirtings also retreated, with 19-19.5 and 21 mic falling 5 cents and the 20-20.5 mic falling 10 cents. Passed in Rate: 31% Major Buyers: PJ Morris, BWK Elders, Kathaytex, Dewayrin, Modiano & Iempriere

Next Week: All centres are selling next week with close to 67,000 bales rostered for sale.







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
