NORTHERN REGION MARKET REPORT -


Auction sales were held in Sydney, Fremantle and Melbourne this week. This week's offering was slightly smaller than last week with a national offering of approximately 65,500 bales.

Sales opened nationally in Melbourne on Tuesday and prices were generally slightly weaker compared to last week. Merino fleece prices were up to 5c/kg clean cheaper with 23 and 24 micron fleeces the most affected, around 10c/kg clean lower. Crossbred fleeces were around 2c/kg clean cheaper in Melbourne and merino skirtings were around 5c/kg clean lower.

When sales opened in Sydney on Wednesday most merino fleeces were unchanged but broader fleeces were lower. 24 micron was the most affected, falling 28c/kg clean. Crossbreds were around 10-15c/kg clean lower. Merino skirtings closed at similar levels to last week. On Thursday there was good support for finer fleeces, with some better style 17 micron lots rising up to 50c/kg clean. 18/19 micron fleeces were around 5c/kg clean dearer. Broader fleece prices were slightly firmer with only 22 micron, on the back of low underlying demand, finishing the day cheaper. 30/32 micron crossbred fleeces were 10-15c/kg dearer. Merino skirtings were again generally unchanged. However, skirtings with less than 3% vm are scarce at present, and are attracting stronger demand in comparison to the higher vm skirtings. Passed-in rates for the week averaged around 17%.

Despite the Australian dollar falling below 72c US on Wednesday night and Thursday, economic analysts indicated that the fears of higher US interest rates, the ongoing tensions in Iraq and speculation of a weaker Chinese economy seem to be affecting all commodity prices at the moment. As a result the Chinese seem to be lowering their prices for wool at the moment, with the broader end the most affected. It is interesting to note in the graph below that the price gap between the finer microns and the broader microns is starting to widen. Currently if the market falls the broad end is falling 10-15c/kg clean but when the market rises the broader end is only rising 2-3c/kg clean. Sales continue in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle next week.


