Some good news for woolgrowers this week as prices rose sharply across all microns after several weeks of heavy price falls. There were indications that the market might improve when Macquarie Wool Futures prices rose 10 c/kg clean last Friday and then rose 20-35 c/kg on Monday and a further 20-25 c/kg clean on Tuesday. Macquarie Wool Futures also rose on Wednesday a further 25-50 c/kg clean and was particularly

stronger for maturity dates for August 2003 and beyond.

At Wednesday's auction prices for Merino fleece wools rose 45-75 c/kg clean for 19-21 micron and 20-30 c/kg clean for 18.5 micron and finer. 26 micron and broader fleece wools were unchanged to 10 c/kg clean firmer. Merino skirtings were up to 4% dearer, crossbreds were up to 1.5% dearer and oddments were 4-5% dearer. The passed-in rate for Wednesday was 9.5%.


On Thursday prices rose a further 20-65 c/kg clean for 19-24 micron Merino fleece wools. 18.5 micron and finer fleece wools were 1-4 c/kg clean dearer. 26 micron and broader fleece wools rose between 5-30 c/kg clean. Merino skirtings were 3-4% dearer and crossbreds and oddments were both 3-4% dearer. The passed-in rate for Thursday was 7.8%.

Auction offerings were small this week with many growers not willing to sell at levels of last week. Consequently, with limited supply and some renewed interest from Europe and India, demand out- weighed supply and for the first time in 5 weeks, the market entered positive territory. Interesting to note China has shown a little more interest now that prices have begun to move up again. Growers with wool on Wooltrade took advantage of the higher prices this week, with keen demand and premium prices paid for the better spec 70%yld, +40NKT types.

Sales continue next week in Fremantle, Sydney and Melbourne.


