NORTHERN MARKET REPORT -

Australian Dollar 76.22 US as of 31/08/2006

On Wednesday Melbourne had 10,801 bales offered with 7.1% or 767 reoffered bales. The market opened firm. The 17 mic rose 5 cents, 18.5 rose 2 to 3 cents, 19.5 mic rose 2 cents, 21 mic rose 5 cents and 22-24 mic rose 2-3 cents and most others remained firm. Merino skirts 20-21.5 mic rose 10 - 14 cents with other types remaining firm. XB fleece fell slightly on a limited offering. Locks were firm and crutchings were unchanged. The Southern indicator closed +1 cent. Passed in rate: 9.3%. Major Buyers: Itochu, AS Gedge, Modiano, Kathaytex & Chargeurs.

Melbourne had 10,900 bales on offer on Thursday (1,308 bales or 12.9% were reoffered lots). Prices for 17 to 17.5 rose 20 cents, 18.0 mic rose 26 cents, 18.5 rose 12 cents, 19-19.5 mic rose 8 cents, 20 mic and 22 mic rose 3 cents and all others remained firm. The crossbreds gained 10 cents for the 28 & 30 mic types. The finer lower vm merino skirtings closed 13 cents firmer and all others were dearer. The washing locks and crutchings rose slightly. Passed in rate: 6.0%. Major Buyers: Itochu, Kathaytex, Modiano, AS Gedge, Fox & Lillie & Chargeurs.

The Sydney market opened on Tuesday with 7,204 bales offered (727 or 10.1% were reoffered lots). The market closed with the 17 mic rising 11 cents, 19mic rose 4 cents & 20.0 rose 6 cents The 18.5 to 20.2 mic more stylish skirts with VM 5 to 8% closed 10 cents dearer. A small offering of XB flc saw them rising slightly. Locks 19 to 21 mic rose 10 cents and crutchings remained firm. Passed in rate: 9.1%. Major Buyers: AS Gedge, Techwool, BWK Elders, Southern Cross & Chargeurs.

Sydney on Wednesday had 8,806 bales offered (994 or 11.3% were reoffered lots). The market opened firm with the 19.5 to 21.0 micron fleece rising 3-6 cents, 22.0 mic rose 7 cents and 23.0 plus 1 cent. The more stylish skirts 4-8VM with good length were slightly dearer and others remained firm. The finer locks rose slightly and others were unchanged. Crutchings also closed firm. Passed in rate: 5.4%. Major Buyers: Southern Cross, Chargeurs, AS Gedge, Techwool and BWK Elders

On Thursday the Sydney market closed fully firm to slightly dearer. There were 5,060 bales on offer (268 bales or 5.3% were reoffered lots). Prices for 19 and 20 to 21.0 mic fleece rose 3-5 cents. Merino skirtings closed 12 cents dearer for the best lines while oddments were slightly firmer. The 28.0 crossbreds remained unchanged. Passed in rate: 6.0%. Major Buyers: Techwool, Southern Cross, Chargeurs, Modiano & AS Gedge.


In Fremantle on Wednesday there were 6,512 bales offered (1,035 bales or 15.9% were reoffered lots). The market closed with 19.0 rising 13 cents, 19.5 rose 16 cents and 20-21.0 mic rose 12 cents and 22.0mic rose 8 cents. The skirts remained firm. Washing locks rose marginally and crutching were 3 cents dearer. Carbo locks remained firm. Passed in rate: 11.6% Major Buyers: PJ Morris, BWK Elders, Modiano, Itochu, H Dawson & Grain Corp


Fremantle on Thursday had 6,661 bales offered (806 bales or 12.1% were reoffered lots). The market opened firm with 19 to 19.5 micron fleeces rising slightly, the 21 microns rose 6 cents and 22 to 24 mic rose 3 cents. The finer skirts were 18 cents firmer with others rising 10 cents. Washing and carbo locks were firmer. Crutchings were unchanged. Passed in rate: 13.8%. Major Buyers: PJ Morris, BWK Elders, Modiano, H Dawson and Grain Corp.



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
